ALLIED HEALTH

Does caring for individuals who are sick interest you? Or trying to determine what illness a person has? Maybe you like approaching health from an angle of prevention, or developing research for cures, or using technology to treat a disease. In Allied Health, students will build a wide range of basic knowledge that can be applied to a variety of health care careers. This knowledge base includes (but is not limited to) learning medical terms, medical ethics, prevention of illness, anatomy of body systems as well as the diseases that affect that system, how food and exercise play a role in health, and a view into insurance. Students will take that knowledge and apply it to health care skills such as taking vital signs, performing CPR & using an AED, basic patient care skills (use of wheelchair, bathing, feeding) and safety precautions. There is a lot to learn if you want to work in health care, but students will tell you it does not feel like work if you are interested in learning how your body works in health and illness.
